



WHAT IS SCOTLAND'S CLAIM OF RIGHT? WHAT DOES IT DO AND WHY DOES IT MATTER?

If you think it guarantees democracy, our right to decide the kind of government we want in Scotland, you're right. But it does more than that. Much more.

The **CLAIM OF RIGHT** upholds Scotland's long-hidden Constitution:

- A Constitution that puts the common good at the heart of government policy
- A Constitution that protects our people and our rights from the oppression and tyranny of an unaccountable government
- A Constitution that raises the authority of the people above the power of the state

The **CLAIM OF RIGHT** is still our law. **It cannot be overturned, repealed or amended.** If most of us don't know about it, that's because it was buried and ignored by the UK establishment, who hoped it would just...go away. Why?

Ask yourself one question. If you could sack Westminster for its crimes against the people of Scotland, would you? The **CLAIM OF RIGHT** says you can! That's why. It has never gone away. And as long as Scotland is still Scotland, it never will.

It's the British state's very own, 'inconvenient truth'. A truth that can set Scotland free. It just needs us to know it, proclaim it, and use it - together, to claim what is, and what always was, ours.

THE CLAIM OF RIGHT MAKES IT A CRIME FOR THE STATE TO:

- Restrict the right to protest
- Restrict the right to justice
- Remove civil rights or liberties
- Invade your privacy
- Offer financial advantages, (e.g., huge tax breaks and big financial contracts), to the few, to the detriment of the 'common good'
- Divert the benefits of our common resources from the many, to the few
- Misuse the law for political ends
- Exercise power that is neither directly answerable to nor accountable to the people, because
